CITY MANAGER**

- State Representative Curt VanderWall has scheduled his coffee hour for Monday, June 18 at City Hall from 8-9 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS

City Manager Williams noted that a revised final pay request for the USDA Water Project was at their place setting. As the finished project came in under the loan amount, Rural Development is requiring us to draw down the full loan amount and then we can send that portion back to them to go against the principal. At this time the amounts requested are \$10,977.82 engineering, \$54,415.91 construction and \$30,331.89 payment to principal. Williams is recommending the Commission approve the final pay application in the amount of \$95,725.62. Motion, by Spencer and seconded by Begue, to approve the final pay request for the USDA water project as presented. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

The DDA is requesting that Main Street south from State Street to north of the driveway of the Dollar General Store, North Main Street from State Street to the driveway of Wesco and if needed First Street from South Main Street to Crowley, be closed on Saturday, July 7 from 7a.m. – 3p.m. so the events for Scottville 10 & 31 Celebration can be held. Williams noted several events from the Harvest Festival and Summerfest, plus some new ones, will take place Friday and Saturday July 6 & 7 at different locations in and around the business district. Motion, by Spencer and seconded by Cole, to approve the street closure request as presented. Motion carried.

The Mason County Central Education Foundation is sponsoring a river race on Saturday, July 7 and would like to partner with MCE Food Service to provide food for the participants and anyone else who attends the river race at Riverside Park. Motion, by Krieger and seconded by Spencer, to approve the request to have a food truck at Riverside Park on July 7. Motion carried.

Smith and Eddy Insurance Company is having their annual Customer Appreciation Day on August 1st and they are requesting that they be allowed to have a food truck on their premises to serve the food. Motion, by Cole and seconded by Petipren, to approve the food truck request. Motion carried.

Eight property owners have delinquent water bills that need to be placed on the 2018 summer tax roll in the amount of \$1,829.52. Motion, by Spencer and seconded by Genson, to approve the special assessments for water bills as presented. Motion carried.

Two property owners have past due invoices for lot mowing and they need to be placed on the 2018 summer tax roll in the amount of \$387.50. Motion, by Begue and seconded by Cole, to approve the special assessments for lot mowing as presented. Motion carried.

The MCC High School Forensic Team recently won the State championship and their coach, Tom Richert earned the Coach of the Year Award. In recognition of these achievements Mayor Krieger presented Mr. Richert, along with two of his students, a resolution of acknowledgement on behalf of the City.
