Staffing issues at the COL has brought the rental inspector agreement to a temporary halt. Newkirk has been working with the Fire Department on pool fill protocol.

Many residents reported their disappointment with the lack of flags displayed downtown for Memorial Day.

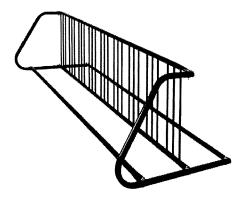

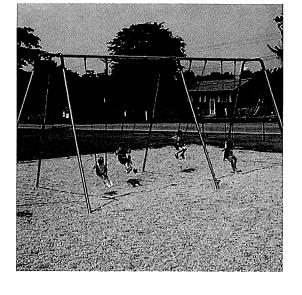
