

ELECTION UPDATES BEGINNING IN 2024:

In the last State election held in November of 2022, Michigan electors voted to approve proposal 2022-2. With that new law, there will be some changes in the voting process for federal and state elections in the future. The biggest new change allows for early voting for 9 consecutive days prior to Election Day. Early voting is only required for Federal and State elections. This is in addition to Absentee Voting, so there are now three ways to vote in a Federal or State election, you may vote Absentee, vote during the 9 days of early voting or vote at our precinct on election day. Any special elections for the townships, counties or schools will not give the voters the opportunity to vote early but it will be available for the presidential primary to be held on February 27, 2024. Early voting will not be done at your precinct but will be held in the Mason County District Library in Scottville. Another change will be there is no longer a permanent absent voters list. The new list will be called the Permanent Ballot list. Anyone can apply to be on the Permanent Ballot list by visiting Michigan.gov/vote or by obtaining a new application from their clerk.
